CAR PARKING

Yellow hashed areas, disabled bays and newly laid grass!

Please can I remind anyone using a vehicle to collect children from school, that the yellow hashed areas and the double yellow lines in and around the car park are **not** to be parked on in any circumstance. All of this is to ensure the safety of our children leaving the school. When cars park in these areas it really does make the car park become dangerous. Should the situation not improve, then we are going to have to look at alternatives such as closing the car park for collection as the safety of the children must come first.

The disabled bays must only be used by vehicles displaying the official blue disabled parking badge - any vehicles without a badge will be asked to move.

Please could parents also avoid parking on the grass entrances to houses by the school reception and in the narrow part of the lane in this area - we have understandably already received neighborhood complaints regarding this.

NASAL FLU

An email was sent yesterday to all parents regarding the nasal flu immunisation vaccine programme that will be administered here in school on Monday 7th October 2019.

Kernow Health is delivering the flu immunisation programme in Cornwall's schools on behalf of NHS England and this year all children from Reception to Year 6 will be offered the vaccine. The letter advises about the vaccine programme and also how to access the online consent form, but if any parents do not have a computer or have difficulty with this and want their child to have the vaccine then a member of the immunisation team will be here in school on **Monday 23rd September at 2.45 p.m.** to assist you.

Head Lice

We have recently had more reports of children having Head Lice. To prevent the Head Lice spreading, please could you check your children's hair and if any head lice or eggs are found, take appropriate steps to eradicate them e.g. the 'wet-combing' method which involves washing the hair, applying conditioner and combing through with a special 'nit comb'.
