So, what does 'RJ' look like in a school?

"A restorative school is one which takes a restorative approach to resolving conflict and preventing harm.

Restorative approaches enable those who have been harmed to convey the impact of the harm to those responsible, and for those responsible to acknowledge this impact and take steps to put it right.

Restorative approaches refer to a range of methods and strategies which can be used both to prevent relationship-damaging incidents from happening and to resolve them if they do happen".

As the school settles into the new year, we will be finalising the other areas for our development focus and will keep you informed as this is completed. Now that the legal work to join the 'Leading Edge Academies Partnership' has all been completed, we look forward to working more closely with our partner schools and seeing tangible benefits for all in the school. I shall be continuing to work across the primary schools, particularly on the Isles of Scilly, for one day per week (Thursdays) and I look forward to having the opportunity to share and collect ideas with the other schools.


The disabled bays must only be used by vehicles displaying the official blue disabled parking badge - any vehicles without a badge will be asked to move.
