Maths Update


At St Hilary School, we're always trying to find ways of raising the profile of maths as a subject so that children see it as one, they enjoy rather than dread. Recently, we were fortunate enough to have a magician visit and engage us in tricks that involve maths. The day started with a whole school assembly where Mr Martin dazzled everyone with card tricks and general number fun. It left us feeling baffled! Each KS2 class then had an hour with him to explore the tricks further and have a go themselves. The children (and adults!) were excited, inspired and couldn't wait to try what they had learned at home. We hope it has further engaged our pupils and that it reinforces the idea that maths is everywhere!











The teachers have been working hard on ensuring that all pupils are armed with the basic skills in maths so that they can be readily used and applied in other concepts. One way of doing this is by having a consistent approach to giving children quizzes, games, assessments and challenges throughout the school so that the foundations really are laid for the future. We've also invested time recently in creating a challenging culture by introducing 'Dive Deeper'. Children should be mastering knowledge by deepening their understanding of objectives taught rather than learn superficially only to forget what they've learned a few weeks later! Independently, children should be able to draw, explain, make mistakes, tell stories and prove their learning so we hope this will help them to reason and grapple with the content in order to strengthen their skill.

With our old data tracker discontinued, we decided it was time to refresh the way we assess our children to ensure we have a firm grasp of where gaps in children's knowledge may be and that we are giving every child exposure to the style of tests they will face in Year 6 and beyond. So far, it has been an interesting process and the teachers are using the data to ensure their teaching maximises opportunities to respond to misconceptions and celebrate what our pupils know. In time, we hope that this has a massive impact on the children's understanding of the subject and gives parents an idea of how well their child is performing.



Whilst we acknowledge some parents are anxious about their own knowledge, we would urge as many of you to take part! Not only will a free raffle be held, but FREE childcare will be given in Funzone for any pupils at the school whose parents come along to the session. Please let us know in advance if you'd like to take us up on this fantastic opportunity. It will be held on *Monday 2nd March from 3.45pm-5.30pm* in the hall and various classrooms.

Please note that TTrockstars and Maths Shed continue to be the link between home and school learning and is a vital resource for every child. Any encouragement in using these websites at home would be appreciated!

The PTA are also going to do teas, coffees and cakes while we're running the Book Fair, so it'll be good to see you for a quick cuppa.


£1 book tokens will come out to children on Monday and the children can spend them at the Fair, even though it's a month until World Book Day.


