Class Attendance

This week's attendance hot spot goes to SENNEN class with 100%. Well done all.



Once again thank you for your patience and your continued support with the school's Covid risk strategy. I know for us at school the new regulations are beginning to seem a little bit more like a normal routine, but as ever there are a few important bits to make you aware of and to reinforce this week.

Please can I **signpost you to our school website Covid page**. I have added a couple of new documents to this page over the course of this week, that I feel it is important that you have a look through.

- St Hilary School's Remote Learning Policy this document covers the details of the remote learning offer the school will implement in the case of a return to lockdown or in cases where isolation of an individual or group may be necessary. The aim is to clarify the processes and the expectations for all members of the school community from staff to children and parents. In clarifying this we aim to have a system in place and ready to start with immediacy should the need arise.
- St Hilary School Contingency Plan this document outlines the school's plan considering four graduated tiers of severity of the virus in local and national terms.

Once again can I ask that when waiting for **collection at the end of the day** all parents remain physically distanced and respect the guidance of the school, government and wishes of the whole school community. One pinch point is the school gate so can I ask that no one gathers on either side of the gate and that when leaving everyone keeps their distance rather than all rushing out in a tightly grouped line. I really appreciate your assistance with this.

Drop off timings: Please can I reinforce the need for our second drop off groups – the 9am drop offs – to arrive between 9.00 and 9.10 – and not before so we can avoid children waiting on the playground and mixing our 'Class Bubbles'.

Finally, I would like to take this chance to address some increasing concerns raised by parents this week. I know that everyone can empathise with a sense of increasing anxiety and concern for our children in the current climate, especially with the news reports continually informing us of a rise in cases, a second spike and local outbreaks. In response to this, I would like to reinforce the school's total commitment to keeping the children and the whole school community safe – sticking to the planning and risk assessments in place. However, beyond this reassurance I feel duty-bound to reinforce the government's insistence and our commitment to keeping all children in full-time schooling. Practically, this means that if a parent were to remove their child from school, due to concerns over Covid, without an authorised absence, we have no choice but to report it as unauthorised and are not required to provide remote learning. Put simply at the moment our children are required to remain in school unless illness, Covid related issues, or where personal circumstances have been agreed.
