Parent Surveys

Towards the end of the last lockdown, we sent out a parent survey to ascertain how remote learning went for our families at St Hilary. We take these very seriously and read every comment to ensure that we know what went well and what we can improve. It is important to understand that, if feasible, we do our best to act upon the feedback yet also recognise that the curriculum offer we gave our pupils was the best it could possibly be during the difficult circumstances in which we found ourselves.

We are incredibly proud that over 96% of our pupils engaged with online learning: accessing high-quality lessons and responding effectively in a range of ways showing excellent learning outcomes. In the survey, 91% of parents said that the work was challenging and relevant with 79.6% saying that the amount of work set was about right. We would like to stress how much we appreciate the feedback (whether positive or negative) and will endeavour to adapt our practice in the future.

Here are **some** of the positive comments we received:

- * Remote learning gave greater autonomy for the children to complete the work when they wanted to.
- * Tasks set developed independence.
- * Feedback was varied (written, verbal etc.) kept the child going.
- * Feedback was very fast, relevant, encouraging and helpful.
- * Shout-outs kept children motivated and boosted confidence.
- * A good mixture/variety of formats helped to keep children engaged with their learning.
- Communication was effective with children and parents throughout the lockdown.
- * Supporting mental health was beneficial.
- * Having time to complete tasks when it suited families was useful.
- * Adults reading the class novels was enjoyable for all.
- * Well thought-out tasks with quality feedback that connected to the children's well-being was clear.
- * Progress of learning continued to develop during lockdown.
- * Borrowing technology was invaluable.

At St Hilary, we are always growing, adapting and moving with the times and hope to build on the lessons we have learnt from both lockdowns to ensure that we give our pupils the best education possible. One of our six E's perfectly sums this up: **Evolution.**

Here are some of the suggestions we would like to think about for the future (should we ever enter a lockdown again!):

- * Having more activities that did not rely on technology.
- * Ensuring feedback is as positive and constructive as possible.
- * Having a morning 'sign in' to give a clear direction for the day.
- * Having a checklist of web-based activities that kids can tick off daily e.g. Spelling Shed, Times Table Rock Stars.
- * Improving children's organisation (and helping parents) by giving a timetable of work presented at the beginning of the week.
- * Giving more tips on efficient ways to complete tasks.
- * Having a greater amount of scheduled classes more online 'live' sessions.
- * Ensuring all children know the rules when entering live sessions e.g. no shouting out, hands up.

- * Making sure there were increasing amounts of pre-recorded lessons from the teachers themselves rather than Whiterose.
- * Having clear expectations of the estimated time it might take to complete each activity.
- * Ensuring there are different ways of recording work e.g. not having to sing or speak when not confident to do so.

Moving forward, we are excited to build upon a 'blended learning' approach by incorporating more technology based tasks into our curriculum. Not only will this teach our pupils valuable new skills but it will also prepare them for the wider world developing their independence, problem-solving abilities and resilience.

From the surveys, it was clear that a few parents were anxious (for many different reasons) about their child returning to school; we hope that these feelings have diminished and that they now feel happy, safe and cared for.

As always, please do get in contact if there are any suggestions or comments you may have, as your feedback is very much valued. Here's to more 'normal' times ahead!




