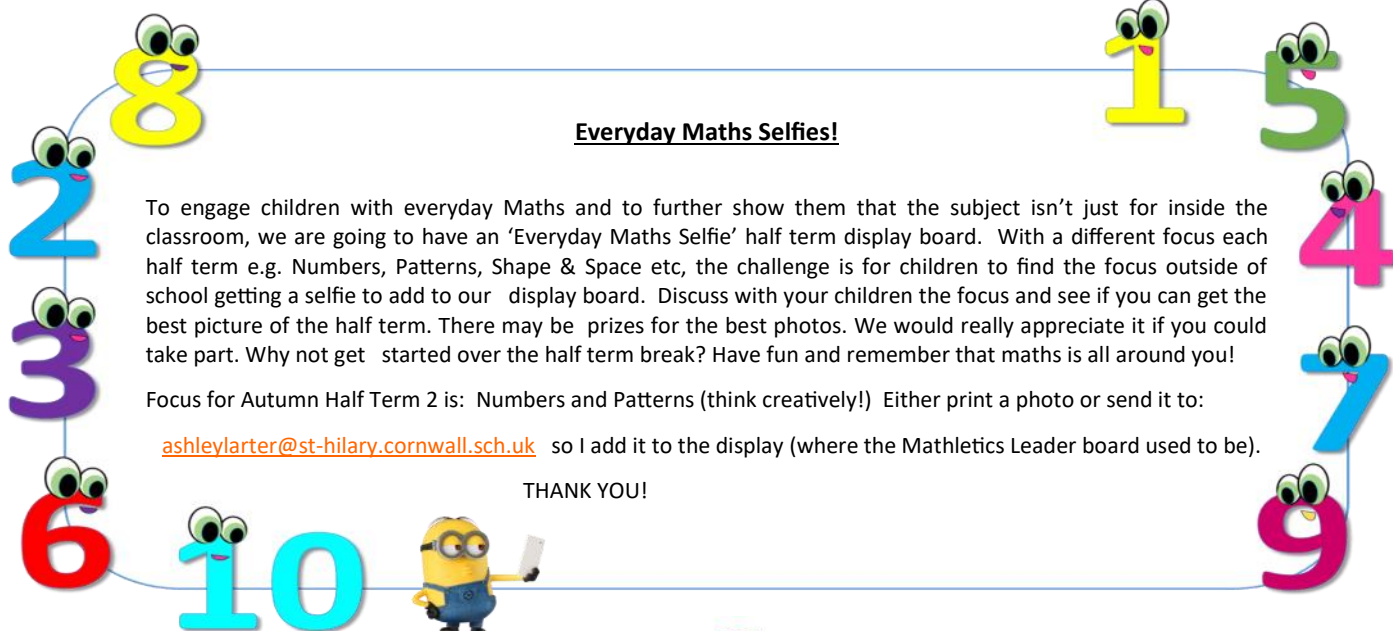
Everyday Maths Selfies!
