We also hope that you will feel positive by the end of the week, supporting you towards your **#5waystowellbeing**.



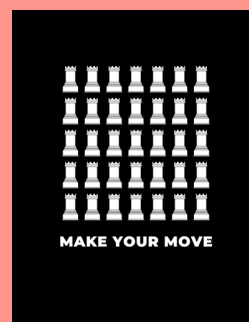

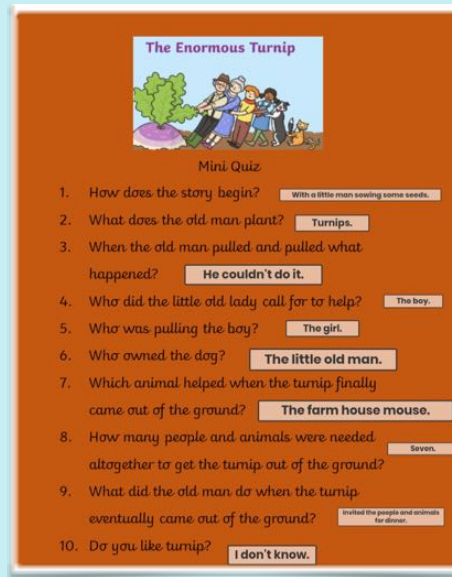
Indie completed some super maths work looking at and recognising tens and ones in 2 digit numbers.



Violet completed some great maths work on seesaw.

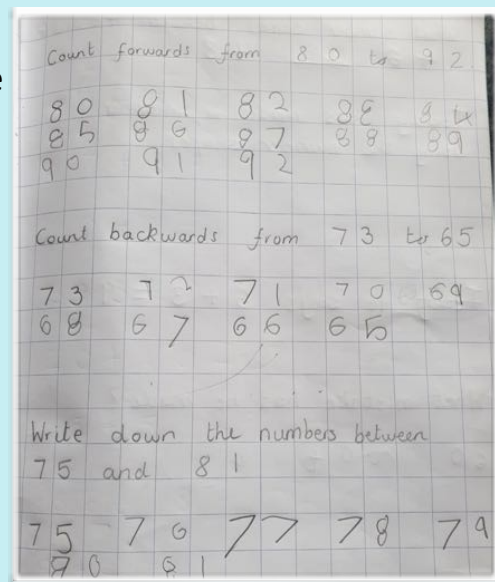

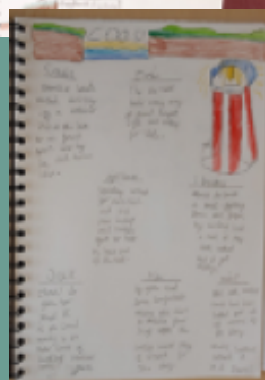
They also seem to be having far too much fun – as Matt's alternative approach to art proves!

Not forgetting our brilliant year 6 home learners who have been completing the same learning and in Mia's case producing some very impressive artwork!

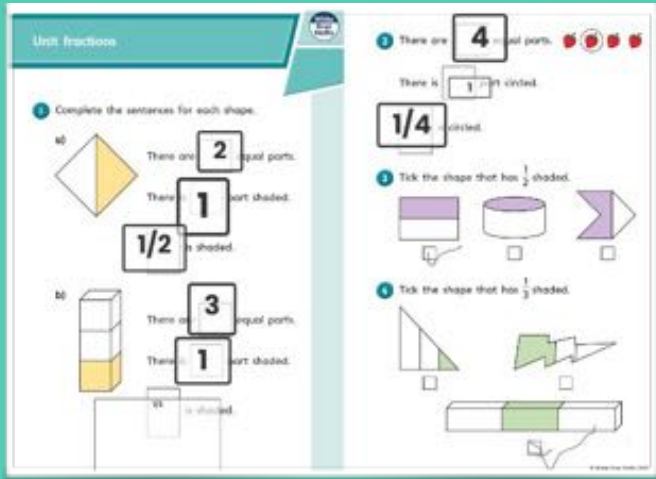
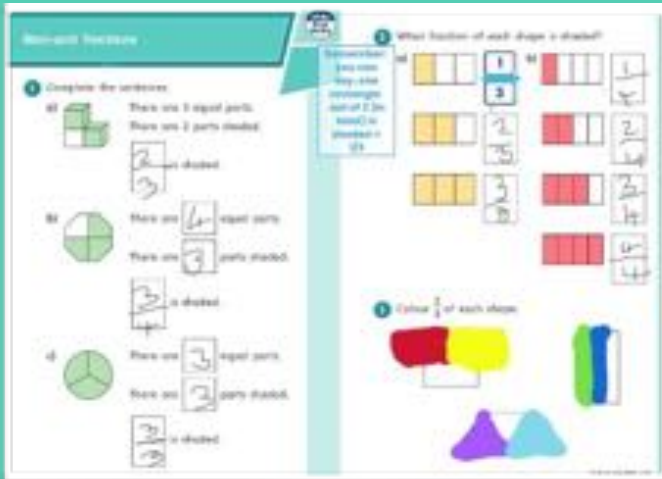

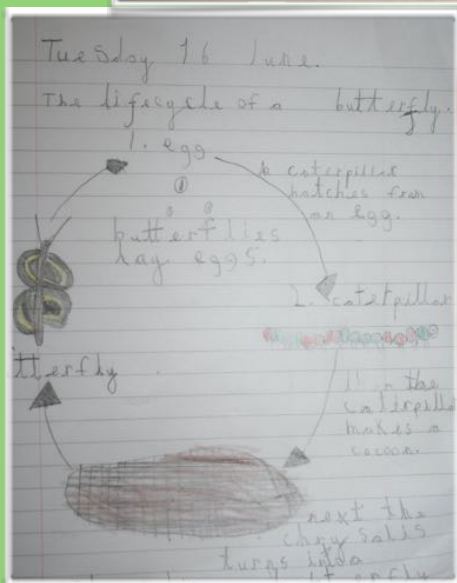
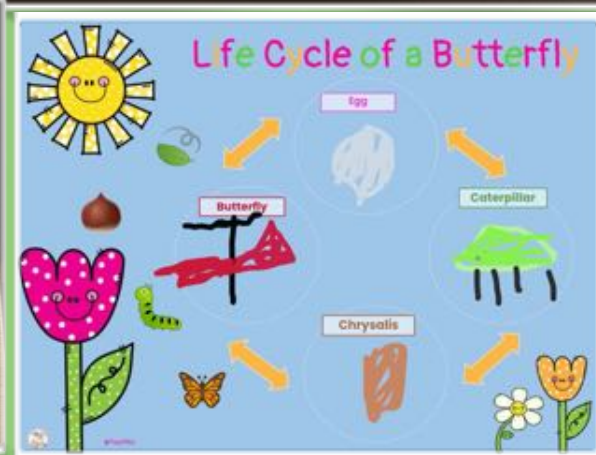
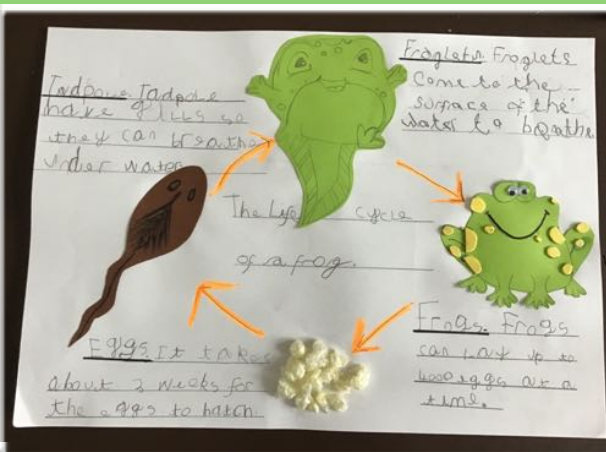
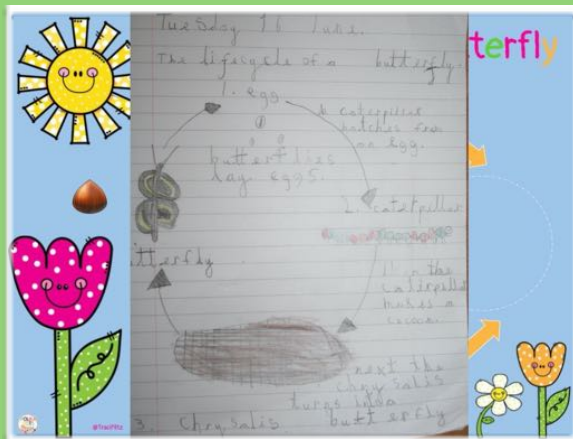
Art work has been inspired by 'Notun' a Japanese term used to express light-dark as an element design. Poppy Da, Ruby B, Archie and Lucy.

We've loved watching videos inspired by 'A day in our lockdown lives' and super efforts were seen by lots of the children including Ruby T, Ava, Florence and Gethin.

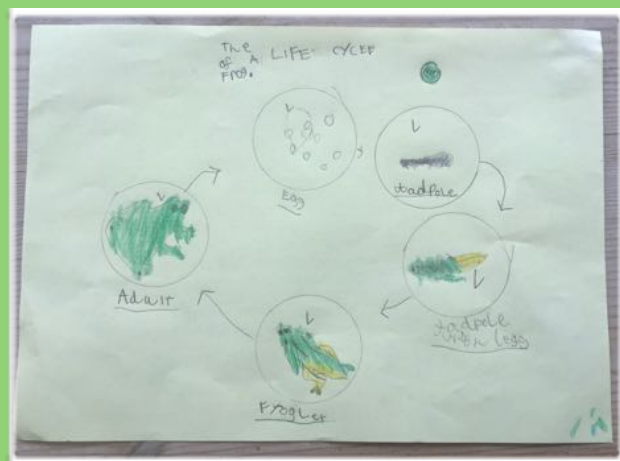
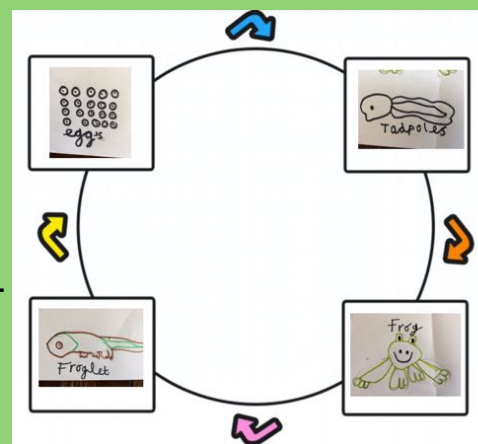

FREE SCHOOL MEALS

So many families will currently be affected by a sudden loss or drop in income. If your financial circumstances have changed, have you considered if you might be eligible for free school meals?



During this time, families of children who are eligible are currently receiving shopping vouchers each week to the value of the usual lunches.

Free school meals are an entitlement for any family who receives:

- Universal Credit with net ("take home") income not exceeding £7,400 (£616.67 per month)
- Income Support (IS)
- Job Seekers' Allowance (Income-based)
- Income Related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part 6 of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guarantee element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit, provided you are not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190, as assessed by HMRC
- Working Tax Credit run-on - paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
