If your child would like to learn to play the **keyboard** (piano) or **guitar**, lessons are arranged and paid for directly with the teachers: Jenna and Morwenna Matthews for keyboard and Darren for guitar. Ask at our school office for further details on these lessons.

Your School Nurse

Your child can have access to a School Nurse at any time if you have any health concerns, in addition your School Nurse offers a full health assessment in reception and year 6.

The School Nurse can check:

- Your child is growing healthily and support with healthy eating
- Support with access to dental care and general support for dental hygiene
- Help with day / night time wetting or soiling
- Provide information about immunisations
- Guidance re healthy lifestyles
- Support with general hygiene issues including head lice and worms
- Support with general emotional health issues
- Support to access other health professionals
- Routines, including sleep

- Friendships
- Relationships
- Development, including periods and puberty
- Access to specialist services including dietician, healthy weight programmes and voluntary services
- Developmental issues
- Transition to secondary school
