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Geography at St Hilary



Mrs Sandow and I have recently taken over the leadership of History and Geography at St Hilary and are currently in the process of auditing our provision so that we can continue to provide an inspiring, relevant and useful education for your children in these areas.



I've started to get my teeth into Geography this term by joining the 'Geographical Association', talking to the children and looking around our school environment for clues about what we are already doing really well.

Findings from initial audit:

- Some of the children (mostly upper KS2) know what 'geography' is and how it relates to maps, countries, biomes, the world, ...
- Our children love learning about different countries and cultures!
- Most of the children can explain why learning geography is important. Comments like 'I'd like to travel when I'm older' and 'it's good to know about how other people live' were frequently heard
- Once the children knew what geography was, they could point to examples on the walls and in their project books.
- Every child spoken to could remember a class trip or experience that linked their project to geography. A lot of our projects have Geography at their heart, but children don't necessarily know that what they're learning is 'geography'

Next steps:

- Supporting the children in being more aware of the presence of geographical skills and knowledge in their learning.
- Ensuring teachers make the most of geographical opportunities within projects and day-to-day. teaching, evidencing these in project books, displays, writing books etc.
- Further embedding the use of our amazing environment within our projects and documenting this.

The whole staff team have been working on producing Knowledge Organisers as you will have previously read about I'm sure; some of these will link to specifically our geography topics, as prescribed by the National Curriculum documentation. For example, the current project in Gwithian Class involves learning about volcanoes and natural disasters and the Year 2 project is about Africa. Some projects have geographical elements running alongside the main project, for example, next term's project in Kynance Cove Class includes learning about rainforest environments alongside learning about plants and the Ancient Maya.



PUPIL CONTACT INFORMATION


As you know we moved to the SIMS Parent Lite app for the purpose of complying with GDPR for collecting and managing pupil data from parents. What this means is that unless a parent comes in to request a paper copy of the data (the old data checking sheets) this is the only way we are informed of any changes.

In order to add/amend the information held for your child you will need to register for the app. This is done from an email that has already been sent, so if possible please could you register as soon as possible. If you have already registered, as a number of you have, please do not go through the process again.

The app is available on iOS, Android and a browser. The SIMS Parent Lite app provides a convenient and accessible solution for you to electronically review and request changes to the data held on your children.

Hopefully the instructions on the right will assist you with the process.
