
CORNWALL VIRTUAL SCHOOL GAMES 2020

participants and nearly 40,000 individual results registered, which AMAZING!





SCHOOL DINNER PRICE INCREASE

school!












This week, Gwenver class have been working exceptionally hard on converting different units of metric and imperial measurements which is no means feat! We also had a TTrockstars battle.




We're almost at the end of our class novel (Cosmic) with great responses in a VIPERS task from Noah M and Poppy Do.




Another busy week of fantastic work from the children of Kynance Cove Class!







FREE SCHOOL MEALS

So many families will currently be affected by a sudden loss or drop in income. If your financial circumstances have changed, have you considered if you might be eligible for free school meals?

During this time, families of children who are eligible are currently receiving shopping vouchers each week to the value of the usual lunches.

Free school meals are an entitlement for any family who receives:

- Universal Credit with net ("take Home") income not exceeding £7,400 (£616.67 per month)
 Income Support (IS)
 - -Job Seekers' Allowance (Income-based)
- Income Related Employment and Support Allowance
 Support under Part 6 of the Immigration and Asylum
- -The guarantee element of Pension Credit
 -Child Tax Credit, provided you are not also entitled to
 Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income
 of no more than £16,190, as assessed by HMRC
 -Working Tax Credit run-on paid for 4 weeks after
