

COMPUTING AT ST HILARY SCHOOL

At the start of last year, the school decided to use a home/school learning platform called Seesaw. You may of heard of it! 😡

As with the start of any school year, targets are set and one of my targets for last year was to implement the use of Seesaw across the school as a school-learning platform for homework. When we heard about possible lock down, Seesaw was quickly brought to the top of our agenda and in the following staff meeting we all learnt how to use it. In the last couple of weeks in school, staff introduced it to the children, and the rest is history. Although there are always glitches to technology, it enabled us to do our best in the circumstances.

I think I can say that my target was well and truly achieved, by all of the staff, parents and children. As the computing lead, I would like to say thank you to our teaching team, including teaching assistants, who are so proactive and enabled this online learning to help support our children over this once in a lifetime event, (fingers crossed), and to the parents who embraced the challenge using a range of computing skills too.

I believe Seesaw was successful due to our whole St Hilary team, not only working on line but benefiting from setting some more traditional tasks. Sitting in front of a screen isn't good for any of us, so setting up a variety of tasks that enabled children to work away from the screen and then uploading them onto Seesaw gave a variety of learning opportunities. Giving children feedback was a real motivator and this helped to keep children on task. Opportunities to share work also improved motivation and enabled them to comment positively on the work of others.



As a school we are continuing to use Seesaw, as we originally intended, for homework and for any other home school links with children and parents. We also intend to use it within the classroom, as and when new equipment is purchased.

When using Seesaw, it is reassuring to know that children are learning in a safe environment and that work and comments can only be posted, if approved by a teacher. It gives the children an added opportunity to learn how to post positive comments, giving them the skills ready for chatting on social media in the future. However, when using the internet, social media or online games, children need to understand how to keep safe. We encourage the use of technology as an important part of our students' development but always want them to spend their time online safely. Just like the real world there are risks that children should be aware of and which we should all act to protect them from. As part of our curriculum, e-safety is taught as part of every computing unit of work.

Our school website gives some support to parents about e-safety and the children are taught the SMART safety advice as seen on page 10 and 11 in their planners.

The units of work for each year group, link to the main headings of programming, handling data, multimedia and technology in our lives. Where possible we link our termly topic to these areas, and e-safety is embedded in this learning.

As St Hilary builds on what we have learned from remote learning and continues to keep up-to-date with changes within the computing curriculum, we also benefit from working closely with the leaders of Computing at Mounts Bay Academy and other schools within our MAT to give our children the best quality-computing curriculum.


