Head Lice children having Head Lice. To prevent the Head Lice spreading, please could you check your children's hair and if any head lice or eggs are found, take appropriate steps to eradicate them e.g. the 'wet-combing' method which involves washing the hair, applying conditioner and combing through with a special 'nit comb'.

Music Lessons

Did you know your child might be entitled to free or subsidised music lessons?

Following the success of all the children in Year 5 and 6 receiving free music lessons and all performing so brilliantly at the Christmas concerts, if you would like your child to continue or start lessons at school then they could be eligible for subsidised lessons. Please see the flier attached. If you think you might be interested school currently offer lessons through Cornwall Music Education Hub (CMEH) for Brass, Woodwind and String instruments.

If you would like more information about your child starting to play any musical instrument please ask Mrs Eddy and/or visit the CMEH website.

Subsidies for Instrumental and Vocal Lessons

Cornwall Music Education Hub

The Cornwall Music Education Hub is committed to ensuring wider access to music for all children and young people. In order to do this, the Hub manages funding from the Designated Schools Grant to provide free or subsidised instrumental/vocal tuition for school-age children attending Cornish LA or former LA schools.

If the child meets one of the following criteria and is receiving lessons from a Hub Registered Provider they will be entitled to a 100% subsidy of up to £5.00 per lesson:

- Currently eligible for Free School Meals (not including FSM universal entitlement for Infants School pupils)
- Currently in Care
- One or more parents/carers in the household are currently serving in the British armed forces


If the child meets the following criteria and is receiving lessons from a Hub Registered Provider they will be entitled 50% subsidy up to £2.50 per lesson:

 Parent/carer in the child's household or child learning is in receipt of Disability Living Allowance (Personal Independence Payment)

If you think that you would be eligible for music lesson subsidies, please speak to your school or provider of tuition.

There are also subsidies available for CMEH instrument hire and CMEH orchestra/ choir/ensemble membership.

CORNWALL COUNTY CHOIRS



Aged 3—8? Love singing? Mini Singers is Comwalf's County Choir for boys and girls aged 3 - 8. Expect a variety of songs with plenty of incovernent and actions. No auditions, just bring a smille!

The Cornwall Music Education hub has extended the Cornwall County Choir family to include younger singers from ages 3 to 8 years old. The Mini Singers and Junior Mini Singers will take place in two locations: Penzance (weekly during term time) and Truro (monthly during term time).

Penzance Weekly Sessions - Tuesdays

Mini Singers (for children aged 3 - 5 years)

4pm – 4.30pm weekly on Tuesdays at St Mary's IC of E Primary School, Redinnick Place, Penzance. Children to be accompanied by an adult for the duration of the session.

Junior Mini Singers (for children aged 6 – 8 years)

4.30pm – 5.15pm weekly on Tuesdays at St Mary's C of E Primary School, Redinnick Place, Penzance.

Parents not required to stay for the sessions.

What does it cost to join Mini Singers and Junior Mini Singers?

Choir members pay a termly membership fee which is subsidised by the Cornwall Music Education Hub. The current termly fee is £30 for Mini Singers (10×30 minute sessions for children aged 3-5 years) and £35 for Junior Mini Singers (10×45 minute weekly sessions for children aged 6-8 years). Mini Singers County Choir membership includes a Cornwall County Choirs T-Shirt.

Places for these groups are limited and pre-booking is essential.

Children aged 3-5 must be accompanied during the sessions.
