

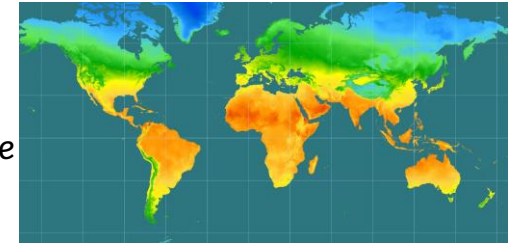
# What makes our World wonderful?

## Key Vocabulary

<b>Temperature</b>	A measure of how hot or cold something is.
<b>Climate</b>	The usual weather conditions of an area.
<b>Country</b>	Land on Earth that ruled by a single government.
<b>Equator</b>	An imaginary line drawn around the middle of Earth, dividing it into the Northern and Southern Hemispheres.
<b>Weather conditions</b>	The way the air and atmosphere feels with different types of weather.
<b>Arctic</b>	The area around the North Pole; very cold.
<b>Desert</b>	A large area of land that has very little rainfall and where not much grows.
<b>Ocean</b>	A large body of water which covers a large area of the earth.
<b>Continents</b>	A very large area of land that includes all the islands with it.

## Key Learning

Countries around the world have different climates. Climates can be sorted into the following zones: warm, cold (or polar), tropical and temperate. Countries near the equator tend to have a hotter climate. Different animals are better suited to living in countries with a particular climate.

### Cold Areas – The Arctic



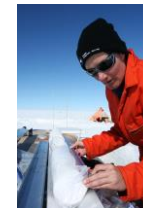
